

The Gambia Sunday 26 November to Sunday 3 December 2017

The study visit is run and organised by Pam Copeland and Dr Des Bowden the directors of B&C Educational Ltd.. Pam taught in primary schools before becoming a senior university lecturer in citizenship and Des is a former head of a university geography department and has worked in West Africa. B&C have introduced heads, teachers, governors and others to The Gambia for many years. They have built a good network of Gambian educational contacts in nursery schools, lower basic schools, The Gambia College, NGOs and the Ministry of Education.



The course will :-

- provide detailed briefing (health and safety, medical, currency, clothing etc) and follow up sessions,
- · offer ongoing support from the course leaders following the visit,
- provide an introduction to the culture, life and environment of The Gambia, West Africa,
- investigate the Gambian educational system by visiting schools and/or participate in sessions and talks with Gambian colleagues (teacher groups, and teacher trainees),
- initiate educational links and establish relationships with a range of Gambian schools and continue those that have already been established,
- encourage linking between like-minded but diverse schools across UK authorities and The Gambia.

The costs will cover:-

- all travel and seven nights' accommodation based on twin de-luxe rooms in the four star Ocean Bay Hotel, Cape Point on a bed and breakfast basis,
- return flights from UK, 15 kgs baggage, transfers to and from hotel in The Gambia,
- ATOL protection for the flights and hotel,
- services of local guides,
- use of local transport,
- a full daily itinerary, with support, guidance and all entrance fees, (Makasutu Cultural Forest, MyFarm, Botanical Gardens, etc).

The whole study visit will cost £895 (to include the briefing and follow-up meetings). To confirm your participation please complete attached form and include a booking deposit of £95 and arrange to pay a further £800 by 18 August 2017 (if you prefer payment can be made in two tranches, £560 by 18 August and a further £250 by 12 November (includes a small handing charge))
